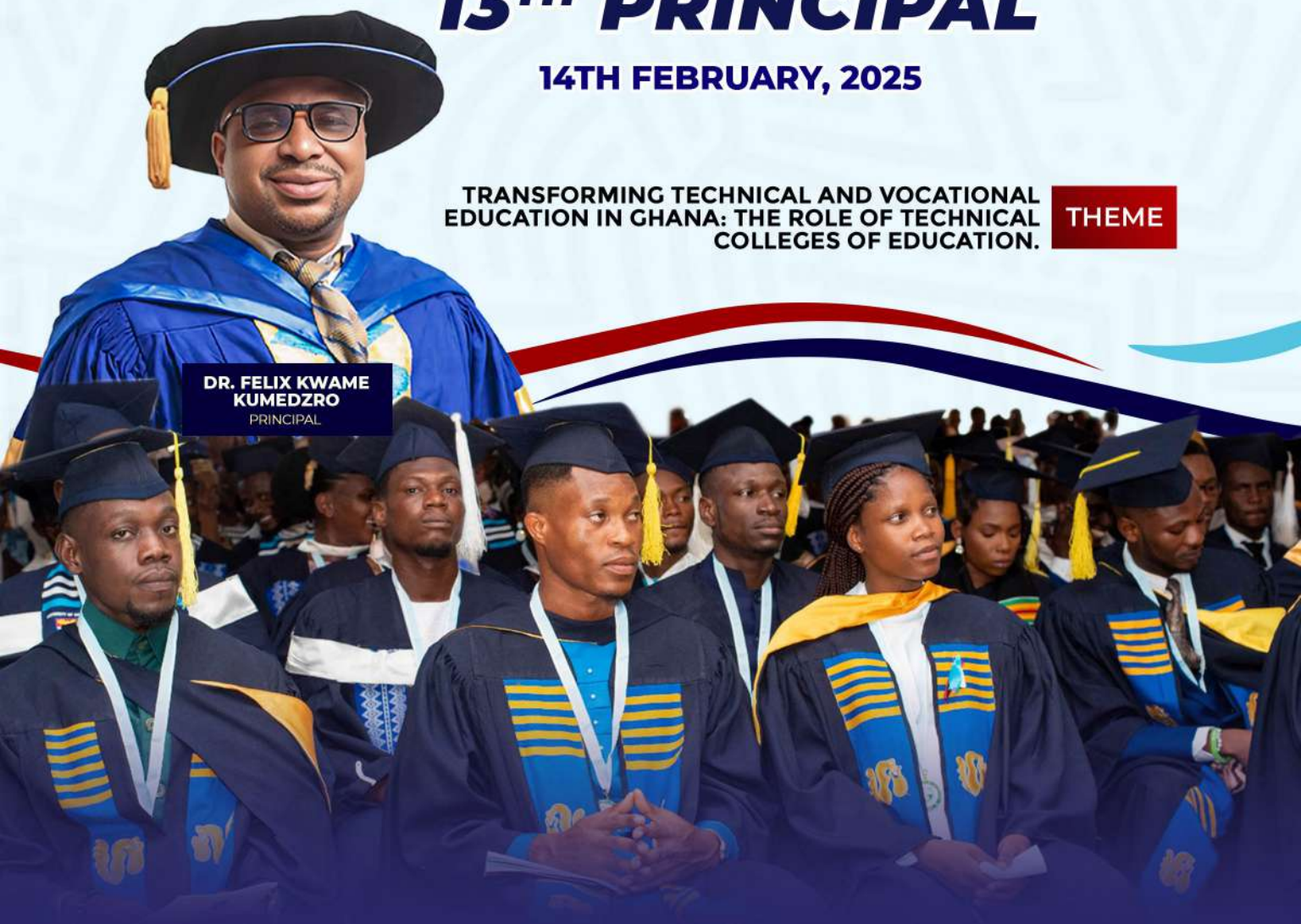

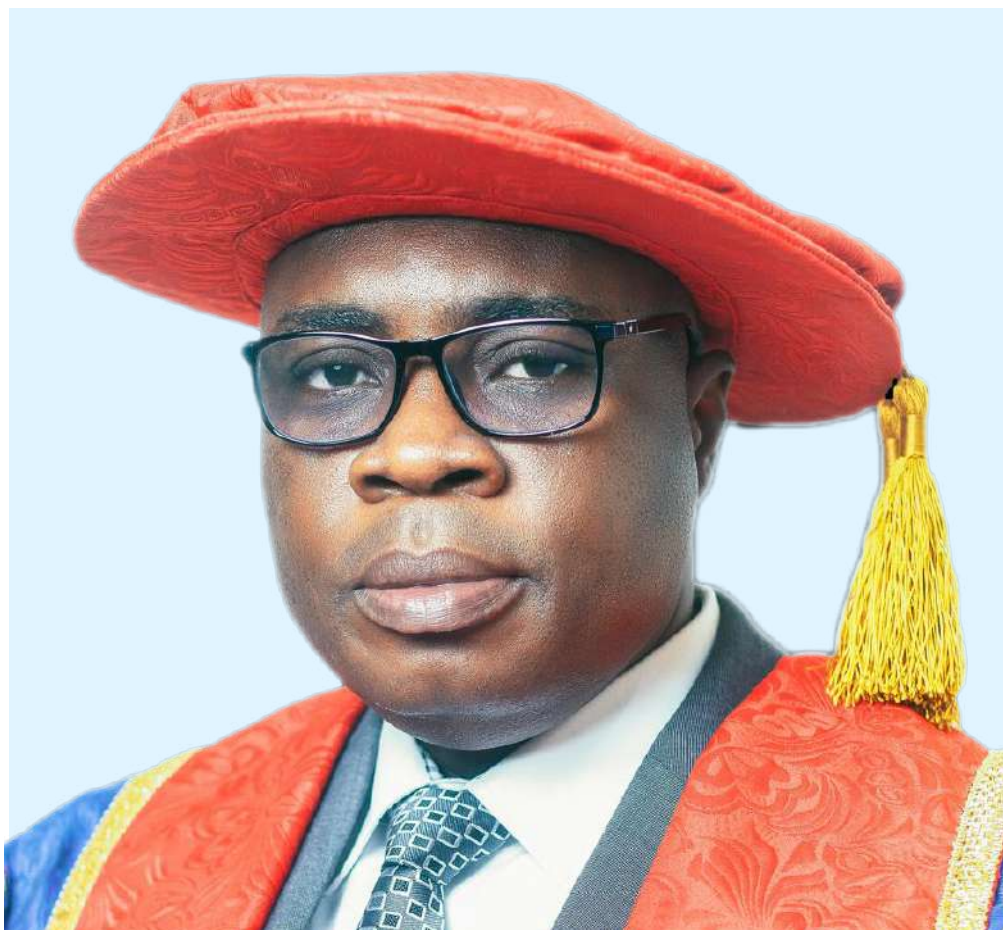

BRIEF HISTORY OF AKATSI COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

Founded in October 1963, Akatsi Training College opened her doors to the first batch of forty-two (42) all-male students. Apart from the first Principal, the late Mr. Seth K. Ahiable, there were three other tutors constituting the teaching staff. The three men who helped to lay the academic foundations of the College with the Principal were Messrs Cletus A. Akorlie (as Senior House Master), Michael Adodo Gaba and Leo M. Adotey. According to the records, by October 28, 1963, the initial intake of 42 had risen to 56 students.

The idea of establishing a Teacher Training College at Akatsi was the brainchild of the then Member of Parliament for Avenor (as the constituency was then known), Hon. M.K. Maglo and the then District Commissioner (DC), Mr. John G. Bedzo. Torgbui Letsa Korba II, Dufia of Akatsi, who willingly provided the tract of land which currently stands the structures of the College.

Akatsico had seen very humble beginnings when she was housed in the deserted wooden and corrugated roofing sheet structures of Taylor Woodrow Construction Company that built the Accra-Aflao Road (also known as John Miller Road, named after the firm's Chief Engineer). A number of these structures still stand today albeit in very sorry states of dilapidation. The

first Principal's office had survived the many years of termite attacks and defiantly stands as a museum piece monument beside the College resource centre.

Driven by the echoes and reverberations of the national needs for education, the founding fathers chose the motto: HEAD, HEART, HAND for the College. The choice of this motto is significantly in consonance with the College's mission of giving its trainees a holistic education that builds the individual intellectually, physically and in the affective domain.

The College became a co-educational institution in 1967, four years after its inception and the first batch of female students, numbering twenty-four, were enrolled.

In 2004/2005 academic year, the status of the College changed from that of a Certificate awarding Institution to a Diploma awarding institution hence the change in name of the College from Akatsi Training College to Akatsi College of Education.

PROGRAMMES

Ever since the establishment of the College, it had run a number of courses as determined by National Educational Policy and needs. At various times, students of the College pursued such courses as:

- Cert 'A' 4-Year (Post middle);
- Cert 'A' 3-year (post-Secondary);
- Cert 'A' 4-year (Modular);
- A 2-year Specialist Course in Agriculture;
- A 2-Year Sandwich Top-Up Diploma Course for Cert 'A' teachers;
- A 4-Year Untrained Teachers' Diploma in Basic Education (UTDBE); and
- Diploma in Basic Education (DBE) Programme.

The Diploma in Basic Education (DBE) Programme brought with it the IN-IN-OUT concept of training where students received two years training on campus and spent one year off campus on teaching practice. This was the regular group of the continuing students of the College.

The first batch of the 2 Year Sandwich Top-Up Diploma Course for Cert 'A' teachers completed their course in June/July, 2009 and the course had since been discontinued as well as the UTDBE. The College was also one of the ten designated Colleges nationwide that offered a special Mathematics and Science Course for her mainstream students.

Currently, the College runs only the 4-year Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) Degree Programme as the 3-year Diploma in Basic Education Programme phased out at the end of the 2019/2020 academic year.

The introduction of the 4-year B.Ed. Programme was in line with changing educational trends in the country aimed at revising the Educational Curriculum and producing a new crop of teachers; teachers equipped with more modern and interactive ways of teaching and the College had been part of the DFID funded TTEL Programme right from the programme's inception. In view of the changing educational trends the College was affiliated to the University of Education, Winneba in the 2019/2020 academic year.

In the history of the College, it has passed through the hands of twelve Principals, four of whom acted in that capacity. The thirteenth Principal who currently superintends over the affairs of the College is in the Person of Dr Felix Kwame Kumedzro.

Dr. Felix Kwame Kumedzro

Dr. Felix Kwame Kumedzro was born on Saturday, 27th November, 1971 at Tegbi in the Anlo District in the Volta region. The parents are the late Inspector John Korbla Kumedzro and Madam Peace Mawutor Wugoh both of whom hail from Tegbi. Dr. Felix Kumedzro is the first born among his ten siblings and all family members affectionately call him “Wofa” a two version of Uncle. He was born into Catholic Church family, baptized at Dzelukope Roman Catholic Church and confirmed in the same church in July, 1990 by Bishop Francis Ledonu.

Dr. Felix Kumedzro had his Primary Education at Urban Council Primary School at Winneba from Primary One to Primary four. He was then transferred to Methodist Primary “B” to continue his Basic Education from Primary five to Primary six. Being a bright and hard-working pupil, he was elected the Head Prefect



when he was in class six. During the second term in class six, his father was transferred from Winneba to Akwatia. Subsequently, Dr. Kumedzro also moved with the parents to enroll at Akwatia Roman Catholic Primary School where he joined his peers at class six. He then went to Akwatia Roman Catholic Middle School where he spent three years in Middle School and sat for the Common Entrance Examination in 1987. He passed successfully and gained admission into Keta Secondary School (KETASCO) in the same year and completed his GCE “O” Level in 1992.

After his GCE "O" Levels, Dr. Felix Kumedzro was employed as a pupil teacher by a private school at Gomoa Nyanyano in the Central Region where he worked for one year before proceeding to Apam Secondary School for his G.C. E "A" Levels in 1993 and successfully completed in 1995. After his GCE "A" Levels, Dr. Kumedzro was employed by Ghana Education Service as a pupil teacher at Akwansrem L/A Junior Secondary School in Adansi East District in the Ashanti Region. During the period of his pupil teaching, he gained admission into University of Cape Coast to pursue Bachelor's degree in Educational Psychology in September, 1999 and graduated in June, 2003.

Upon completion, Dr. Kumedzro was nominated by the then Department of Educational Foundations, University of Cape Coast to undertake his national service as a Teaching Assistant in the Department. While working at the Department as a national service person, Dr. Kumedzro assisted in teaching undergraduate courses, grading students' quizzes, assignments and examinations. He also assisted in coordinating the activities of the Child Development Research and the Referral Unit at the Department. In an attempt to add value to himself as a young man, he enrolled

for his Master of Philosophy (M.Phil) degree in Special Needs Education at the same University and graduated in 2008.

Dr. Felix Kwame Kumedzro is a distinguished scholar of international repute with significant academic and leadership credentials to his credit. He is currently the newly appointed Principal of Akatsi College of Education. Until his appointment, he was a senior lecturer at the College of Distance Education, University of Cape Coast. He holds a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) and Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) degrees in Special Needs Education from Kenyatta University, Kenya and University of Cape Coast, respectively. He also possesses a Bachelor of Education (B.Ed) degree in Educational Psychology from University of Cape Coast and a certificate in Leadership Empowerment from the School of Management, University at Buffalo, USA.

Dr. Kumedzro is a teacher by profession with eight (8) years teaching experience at pre-tertiary level. These include OLA Boarding Basic School, Cape Coast School for the Deaf and OLA Teachers' Training College, all in Cape Coast. Additionally, he has fourteen (14) years of experience in teaching and eleven (11) years of administrative exposure at the university

level. He has served on several boards and committees within and outside the university community. He was the Head of postgraduate programmes at the College of Distance Education from 2020 to 2024 and a member of the College's Middle Management Board from 2010 to 2024. He was also a member of the School of Graduate Studies Board at University of Cape Coast from 2020 to 2024. He served as the Head of Students' Support Services Unit at the College of Distance Education, UCC from 2016 to 2020. Dr. Felix Kumedzro was the first Regional Resident Coordinator to be appointed by UCC to manage the Distance Education programme in the Volta region. Dr. Felix Kumedzro has a deep understanding of the complexities and challenges confronting the education sector in Ghana.

He is a researcher and have published numerous research articles in peer reviewed journals which have earned him international recognition. His research areas include support services for students with disabilities in higher institutions of learning, Inclusion of learners with special needs in regular classrooms, job satisfaction and retention of special needs education teachers in Sub-Saharan Africa. At the moment, he lectures the following courses at

the postgraduate level on part-time basis:

- Ethical and Legal Issues in special and Inclusive Education
- Assessment in Special Education
- Contemporary Issues in Special Education

Dr. Felix Kumedzro has attended sixty-two (62) national and international conferences, workshops and seminars. He has presented his research findings at international conferences in Perth (Western Australia), Kenya (East Africa) and South Africa. He also serves as Internal Examiner for University of Cape Coast and Examiner for some universities in Ghana and abroad

Currently, He is a member of the International Association of Special Education Teachers: Member, National Association of Special Education Teachers in Boston, USA and a member of University Teachers Association of Ghana (UTAG). Again, he is a member of Conference of Principals of Colleges of Education in Ghana (PRINCOF).
